AUGUST 13, 2014

The Mayor and City Council of the City of Syracuse, Nebraska met at 6:00 P.M. on August 13, 2014 for their regular meeting in Council Chambers at 495 Midland Street. 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Jeff Lant, Candidate for Otoe County Sheriff, addressed the Mayor and Council to outline his plans if elected in November. Mr. Lant promised 24-hour a day coverage to all people of Otoe County. This will be accomplished by: 1) Implementing 24-hour coverage by on-duty officers, 2) Creating three patrol districts (West, Syracuse, and East) and 3) Establishing a leadership structure.

Mr. Lant promised Mayor and Council that the City of Syracuse would have 24 hour a day coverage with no exceptions.

SHERIFF REPORT – Chief Deputy Mike Holland was unable to attend the meeting. The report log showed 67 calls for July, 27 being Rescue calls.

Mayor and Council reviewed additional ordinances on driving UTVs and golf carts on City streets received by City Clerk Hobscheidt. Mayor and Council would like to model the City's ordinance after that used by the City of Ravenna. The ordinances outlines vehicles that can be operated on City streets, age of operators, registration process and application and fee to be paid to the City. Also, all vehicles that have made application and been approved; will have a numbered sticker placed on the vehicle.

Mayor Ortiz instructed the City Clerk to have City Attorney Jerry Stilmock draw up an ordinance for the September Council meeting.

PARKS & RECREATION REPORT – Park Manager Todd Aksamit reported that the High School Softball team is practicing at the Sports Complex and the first scheduled game is for August 21st.

Park Manager Aksamit stated that Jordon Lechner is no longer working and the last day for Morgan Mueller is August 22nd. Julie Isaacs will stay on to help with softball games and mowing.

Recreation Coordinator Shayna Aksamit reported that the last full day at the swimming pool is today, August 13th. The pool will be open on the next two week-ends.

Recreation Coordinator Aksamit reported that she has been working on the plaque honoring those individuals that raised funds for the picnic shelter at the Sports Complex. Plans are to place the plaque on a large rock that was originally located by the fishing pond in Williams Park. The rock will be placed by the shelter.

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT – Report presented by Superintendent of Public Works Garry Carman. Superintendent Carman reviewed the Engineer's Final Opinion of probable cost of 2014 Water Main Improvements. The proposal from JEO Consulting Group, Inc. is in the amount of \$142,764.

Council member Lutjemeyer made the motion to approve the Engineer's Final Opinion of probable cost of 2014 Water Main Improvements in the amount of \$142,764.00 and advertise for bids, second by Henke. Roll Call: Yeas: Lutjemeyer, Henke, Dettmer. Nays: None.

Mayor Ortiz stated that Zito Media had signed the Pole Attachment Agreement and had agreed to all of the City's stipulations. The agreement terminates September 30, 2021, unless terminated earlier by either party. The pole attachment fees state at \$10.25 per pole for 2014 - 2015 and cap at \$11.25 in 2020 - 2021.

Council member Lutjemeyer made the motion to adopt RESOLUTION 14-08: A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SYRACUSE, OTOE COUNTY, NEBRASKA TO APPROVE, RATIFY AND ACCEPT THE POLE ATTACHMENT AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF SYRACUSE, OTOE COUNTY, NEBRASKA AND ZITO MIDWEST, LLC; TO APPROVE THE EXECUTION THEREOF, second by Henke. Roll Call: Yeas: Dettmer, Lutjemeyer, Henke. Nays: None.

A true, correct and complete copy of said ordinance is attached hereto and made a part hereof by reference.

Fire Chief Bruce Neemann appeared before Mayor and Council for approval of the 2014-2015 Syracuse Volunteer Fire Department Officers. The officers are Chief – Bruce Neemann; Asst. Chief – Mike Goering; Asst. Chief – Richard Sitzman; Foreman – Eldon Halm; Foreman – Craig Hemje; President – Tim Seelhoff; Secretary – Eric Fass and Treasurer – Chris Lutjemeyer.

Council member Henke made the motion to approve the 2014-2015 Syracuse Volunteer Fire Department Officers, second by Dettmer. Roll Call: Yeas: Henke, Dettmer, Lutjemeyer. Nays: None.

Mayor and Council reviewed the quote received from Bockman Inc. for removal of asbestos containing materials from the Charles Martin and Larry Lawton property. The estimated fee would be \$1,160.00.

Mayor Ortiz explained to Council that the City will not be receiving any Federal demolition funds. If the Council would want to proceed with the demolition of the two properties, the City would be paying the total cost.

Council agreed to not proceed with the asbestos removal at this time and investigate other avenues for demolition of properties.

Council member Henke made the motion to adjourn at 6:40 P.M., second by Dettmer. Roll Call: Yeas: Dettmer, Lutjemeyer, Henke. Nays: None.
