

REGULAR MEETING
CITY COUNCIL

September 11, 2019

The Mayor and City Council of the City of Syracuse, Nebraska met at 6:00 P.M. on September 11, 2019 for their regular meeting in the Syracuse City Hall Council Chambers at 495 5th Street. Notice of meeting was given by posting in three places. Mayor Ortiz requested roll call, present were Mayor Ortiz and Council members Laramie Werner, Jerry Werner, Deb Dettmer, Orv Gigstad. A copy of the posting notice and acknowledgement of notice to the Council is attached to these minutes. Minutes for the August 14th, 2019 meeting were approved as written. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the meeting was open to the public.

Mayor Ortiz led the approval of claims and Treasurer's Reports, Todd Blome of BMG present. BMG has sent the August 2019 report for the Mayor and Council to review. Blome reported all accounts and transactions have been tied out. The statements show eleven months of data for the current budget year. He will be visiting about the year in review at a future meeting in anticipation of the City's annual audit.

Mayor Ortiz opened the budget public hearing and led the discussion on approval of the 2019-2020 budget and approval of additional 1.0% increase in restricted funds. Blome explained the budget documents prepared by BMG, answering questions from the Mayor and City Council. Mayor Ortiz closed the public hearing. Council Member Deb Dettmer moved to approve the additional 1.0 % increase in restricted funds and the 2019-2020 Budget, Orv Gigstad second. Roll Call: Yeas: Jerry Werner, Deb Dettmer, Laramie Werner, Orv Gigstad. Nays: none.

Mayor Ortiz opened the public hearing and Ordinance No. 1057 on hearing, support, opposition, criticism, suggestions, or observations of taxpayers relating to proposed 2019-2020 Budget. No opposition of the budget documents. Mayor Ortiz closed the public hearing. Council Member Jerry Werner moved the statutory rule requiring reading on three different days be suspended. Deb Dettmer seconded. Roll Call: Yeas: Orv Gigstad, Laramie Werner, Deb Dettmer, Jerry Werner. Nays: none. Attorney Stilmock read Ordinance No. 1057 by title. Council Member Deb Dettmer moved for final passage of Ordinance No. 1057, Orv Gigstad seconded. Mayor Ortiz stated the question, "Shall Ordinance No. 1057 be passed and adopted" and requested roll call vote. Roll Call: Yeas: Laramie Werner, Jerry Werner, Deb Dettmer, Orv Gigstad. Nays: none.

Mayor Ortiz opened the public hearing and Resolution No. 19-21 on hearing, support, opposition, criticism, suggestions, or observations of taxpayers relating to setting the final tax request at a different amount than the prior year tax request. No opposition of the property tax levy. Mayor Ortiz closed the public hearing. Council Member Deb Dettmer moved to adopt Resolution No. 19-21, Laramie Werner seconded. Roll Call: Yeas: Orv Gigstad, Deb Dettmer, Jerry Werner, Laramie Werner. Nays: none.

Council Member Orv Gigstad moved to approve the August Treasurer's Report and pay the claims, Deb Dettmer seconded. Roll Call: Yeas: Jerry Werner, Orv Gigstad, Laramie Werner, Deb Dettmer. Nays: none. The claims approved are attached to these minutes.

HEARING OF THOSE PRESENT – No one present.

SHERIFF'S REPORT – Sheriff Caudill present. Caudill reported 74 total calls within the Syracuse during August. Caudill has instructed the deputies to be more accountable on their Syracuse hours. There were 18 traffic stops and six business checks included in the 74 calls. Caudill reported stolen vehicles and property were recovered with the help of home security cameras. Caudill is putting together a program where area home and business owners can put their address on a list where the County can reach out to them if they should need camera footage from these systems. A foot pursuit resulted in an arrest where three warrants had been issued. Further investigations and search warrants resulted in drugs and drug paraphernalia. "Knock & Talk" patrol was used where deputies go door to door asking if anyone has information. County Deputies have been present during morning and after school traffic. Syracuse Area Health worked with the County to have access to 911 via push-button and radio systems enabling them to contact Otoe County dispatch immediately. No deputies are currently in training. The County inmate facility is full and seven inmates are currently housed in other locations.

LIBRARY REPORT – Librarian Antes present; her report was distributed prior to the meeting. Antes reported circulation totals for August '19 are up compared to August '18 with a difference of only five items less this year. Antes reported 56 members in the four book clubs; no additional members will be accepted at this time. In October a catered meal will be provided to the book club members with Speaker Dave Straub present. Pre-school storytime has 34 children enrolled between the Wednesday and Friday sessions.

FIRE REPORT – Fire Chief Bruce Neemann present. Mayor Ortiz led the discussion on approval of new member to SVFD. Neemann presented Scott Wiebusch as a new member. Council member Laramie Werner moved to approve Wiebusch to the fire department, Deb Dettmer seconded. Roll Call: Yeas: Orv Gigstad, Jerry Werner, Deb Dettmer, Laramie Werner. Nays: none.

PARKS & REC REPORT – Parks and Rec Manager Jill Crook present.

Mayor Ortiz led discussion and approval for Mayor's signature on Letter of Commitment needed for Land and Water Conservation Grant. An Opinion of Probable Cost of Construction has been distributed to Mayor and Council explaining how the end funds could turn out after receiving the \$250,000 grant match. Additional costs were included in the opinion document totaling \$75,000.00 not including additional fundraising funds received in the meantime. Council Member Laramie Werner moved to approve Mayor's signature on Letter of Commitment, Jerry Werner seconded. Roll Call: Yeas: Deb Dettmer, Orv Gigstad, Laramie Werner, Jerry Werner. Nays: none.

Mayor Ortiz led discussion and approval of Mayor's signature on Response Letter to Syracuse Foundation. Council Member Laramie Werner moved to approve Mayor's signature on response letter, Orv Gigstad. Roll Call: Yeas: Jerry Werner, Deb Dettmer, Laramie Werner, Orv Gigstad. Nays: none.

Mayor Ortiz led discussion and approval for Mayor's signature on Application for LWCF Grant; Carolyn Gigstad present. The grant application is due by September 13th, 2019. Council Member Jerry Werner moved to approve Mayor's signature on LWCF Grant application. Orv Gigstad seconded. Roll Call: Yeas: Deb Dettmer, Laramie Werner, Orv Gigstad, Jerry Werner. Nays: none.

Carolyn announced \$101,198.10 has been fundraised for the Aqua Center bathhouse.

Mayor Ortiz led the discussion on approval for paving handicap parking at Sports Complex. Baragary Construction supplied a bid of \$11,375.00. Crook asked to have approved and paid out in October 2019 in order to be able to get moving on the concrete while the weather allows it. Council Member Deb Dettmer moved to approve the bid from Baragary, Jerry Werner. Roll Call: Yeas: Deb Dettmer, Jerry Werner, Laramie Werner, Orv Gigstad. Nays: none.

Mayor Ortiz led the discussion and approval to purchase John Deere skid loader and mower. Council Member Deb Dettmer moved to approve purchase of JD Z960MZ Trak mower out of the current year's budget for \$10,200.00, Laramie Werner seconded. Roll Call: Jerry Werner, Orv Gigstad, Deb Dettmer, Laramie Werner. Nays: none. Council Member Deb Dettmer moved to approve purchase of JD skid loader from the 19-20 Budget for the amount of \$41,000.00. Jerry Werner seconded. Roll Call: Yeas: Laramie Werner, Orv Gigstad, Deb Dettmer, Jerry Werner. Nays: none.

Crook also reported the Parks department has been busy keeping up on mowing; Crook has been assisting with mowing. Danner Spray Foam notified Crook they were wanting to start the spray foam job at the complex shop; the parks employees had to take everything out of the shop before the work could start then put everything back and organize. Work has been being done at the 324 6th Street City property. Crook explained a lot of ideas have been discussed but nothing would be done until after the grass is filled in at the lot. Mayor Ortiz asked Crook to send out the ideas to the Mayor and Council as the time gets closer.

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT – Superintendent Jeff Vogt present. Mayor Ortiz led discussion and Resolution No. 19-22 on 2019/2020 One and Six Year Street Plan; Evan Wickersham of JEO not present. The plan had been reviewed at the August City Council meeting. Council Member Laramie Werner moved to approve the 19-20 One and Six Year Plan, Deb Dettmer seconded. Roll Call: Yeas: Orv Gigstad, Jerry Werner, Laramie Werner, Deb Dettmer. Nays: none.

Mayor Ortiz led discussion on extension of Inter-Governmental Agreement between NDEQ and City, authorizing Mayor's signature. Vogt explained this agreement was supposed to terminate April 9th, 2019 but due to the flooding in other areas this agreement needs to be extended. Council Member Jerry Werner moved to approve the extension, Orv Gigstad seconded. Roll Call: Yeas: Deb Dettmer, Laramie Werner, Jerry Werner, Orv Gigstad. Nays: none.

Mayor Ortiz led discussion on authorizing Municipal Water Project Bond Counsel, Tim Moll to move forward with review effort/bond ordinance drafting. Attorney Stilmock explained this would allow Clerk Farmer to forward information provided by DWSRF in order to continue the funding process. Council Member Deb Dettmer moved to approve forwarding information from DWSRF regarding the water project to Tim Moll. Orv Gigstad seconded. Roll Call: Yeas: Laramie Werner, Jerry Werner, Deb Dettmer, Orv Gigstad. Nays: none.

Mayor Ortiz led discussion on Syracuse Water Project Professional Services Agreement; Dane Simonsen of JEO present. Simonsen explained this agreement discusses the arrangement between the City of Syracuse well field and transmission main project and JEO for their services, including additional services such as permitting, construction, storm water prevention plan negotiations to name a few. Attorney Stilmock has not had time to review the agreement therefore Mayor Ortiz recommended tabling the discussion until the following City Council meeting.

OLD BUSINESS – nothing on the agenda for Old Business.

NEW BUSINESS – Mayor Ortiz led the discussion on proposals for City's property insurance including workman's comp. The current policy expires as of October 1, 2019. Two proposals had been submitted for consideration; one from current carrier Clint Simmons of LARM and Mark Easter of Easter and Associates and the other from One Beacon with Erin Ball of Ball Insurance and Trevor Dinovo HUB International. Each company presented their proposals. Various areas were discussed in regards to property insurance, risk, sewer backups to mention just a few. The discussion was tabled until a Special City Council meeting to be scheduled later in September.

Mayor Ortiz opened the public hearing and led discussion on and action on Ordinance No. 1058 for Application for Conditional Use Permit pursuant to Syracuse Municipal Zoning Code Section 5.13 to allow outdoor storage of trailers, campers, motor homes, boats and recreational vehicles at the following-described real estate: Lot 2 in Lot 4 except S 102 Degrees of Lot 2 and less Nebraska Highway 50 Right-of-Way Northwest Quarter, 4.83 Acres Syracuse Annex 22-8-11 City of Syracuse, Otoe County, Nebraska; Kelly McIntosh, Syracuse Self Storage present. McIntosh explained his intentions with the property. No further discussion was had. Mayor Ortiz closed the public hearing. Council Member Orv Gigstad moved to introduce Ordinance No. 1058 and move that the statutory rule requiring reading on three different days be suspended. Deb Dettmer seconded. Roll Call: Yeas: Jerry Werner, Laramie Werner, Deb Dettmer, Orv Gigstad. Nays: none. Attorney Stilmock read Ordinance No. 1058 by title. Council Member Deb Dettmer moved for final passage of the ordinance, Jerry Werner seconded. Roll Call: Yeas: Laramie Werner, Orv Gigstad, Jerry Werner, Deb Dettmer. Nays: none.

Mayor Ortiz opened the public hearing and led discussion on and action on Ordinance No. 1059 to amend Section 5.18 CI-1 Old Towne Commercial/Industrial District to authorize as conditional use outside storage of trailers, campers, motor homes, boats and recreational vehicles. This public hearing also included discussion and action on Ordinance No. 1059 to amend Section 5.18 CI-1 Old Towne Commercial/Industrial District to authorize campground as a conditional use. Attorney Stilmock explained the two items coincide by pertaining to the same zoning district in order to allow conditional use as well as covering uses already going on in the Old Towne Commercial/Industrial District without having prior permission as a conditional use. Mayor Ortiz closed the public hearing. Council Member Jerry Werner moved to introduce Ordinance 1059 and move that the statutory rule requiring reading on three different days be suspended, Orv Gigstad seconded. Roll Call: Yeas: Deb Dettmer, Laramie Werner, Orv Gigstad, Jerry Werner. Nays: none. Attorney Stilmock read Ordinance 1059 by title. Council Member Deb Dettmer moved for final passage of Ordinance 1059, Laramie Werner seconded. Roll Call: Yeas: Jerry Werner, Orv Gigstad, Laramie Werner, Deb Dettmer. Nays: none.

Mayor Ortiz opened the public hearing, discussion and action on Ordinance No. 1060 to amend Section 5.11 C-2 Downtown Commercial District to repeal permitted use of manufacturing of beverages up to

and including 16% alcohol content and re-insert the same as permitted conditional use. Attorney Stilmock explained the item comes from a past City Council member suggesting the above mentioned be made a conditional use instead of the previously approved permitted use. Mayor Ortiz closed the public hearing. Council Member Laramie Werner moved to introduce Ordinance 1060 and move the statutory rule requiring reading on three different days be suspended, Orv Gigstad seconded. Roll Call: Yeas: Deb Dettmer, Orv Gigstad, Laramie Werner, Jerry Werner. Nays: none. Attorney Stilmock read Ordinance 1060 by title. Council Member Deb Dettmer moved for final passage of the ordinance, Jerry Werner seconded. Roll Call: Yeas: Laramie Werner, Orv Gigstad, Jerry Werner, Deb Dettmer. Nays: none.

Mayor Ortiz opened the public hearing and discussion on Application for approval of preliminary plat of the following-described real estate: A tract of land located in the NE ¼ of the NW ¼ of Section 15, Township 8 North, Range 11 East of the 6th P.M., Otoe County, Nebraska. Resubmittal documents had recently been provided by E&A Associates for the Zahn Meadows Preliminary Plat; Evan Wickersham has not had time to thoroughly review the resubmitted information. The public hearing was continued to the October 9th, 2019 at 6:00 P.M. City Council meeting.

Mayor Ortiz led discussion on request to change closing time of bar hours back to 1:00 A.M.; Darren Allen, Owner of Triple D Saloon present. Allen explained he would like the Council to reconsider the 2:00 A.M. approval. Allen understands he doesn't have to stay open that late but he feels the playing field for establishments is not level. The Council would like Attorney Stilmock prepare an ordinance to be voted on at the October City Council.

Mayor Ortiz asked a Council Member to motion to adjourn. Council Member Deb Dettmer moved to adjourn the meeting at 8:33 P.M., Laramie Werner seconded. Roll Call: Yeas: Laramie Werner, Jerry Werner, Deb Dettmer, Orv Gigstad. Nays: none.
